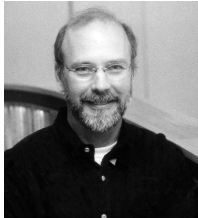




2004-2005 ANNUAL REPORT

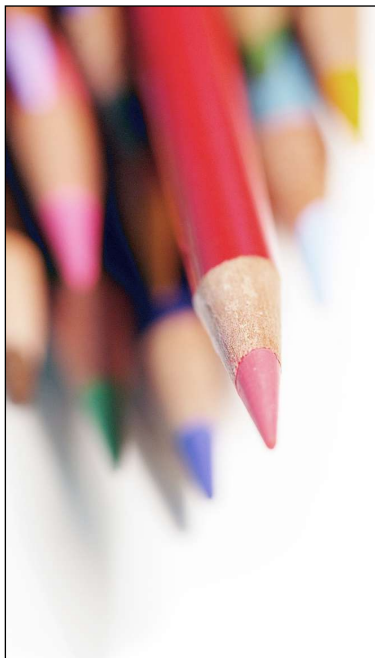
